vars) led the charging Morrisville forward wall and play after play Neshaminy runners were caught behind the line of scrimmage.

But all this was not enough. The Neshaminy defense may not have been as brilliant but it held when it had to and got a break when a Bulldogs' touchdown was called back because of a penalty.

Morrisville's offense was not in high gear, although it gained 97 yards. In the opening quarter, Coach Gordon Davies' Bulldogs took over on their own 34 after an exchange of punts. An Ev Foster to Billy Roberts aerial was good for 29 yards. Two running plays picked up two yards and the Bulldogs had a third down on the Neshaminy 35.

Ev Foster passed to Jim Allison who raced for the TD. But the play was called back because of illegal use of hands.

Pair of Breaks

Neshaminy capitalized on a pair of breaks to score in the final minute of the first half. The Redskins were forced to punt from their own 43. Tom George kicked to the Morrisville 25. Ev Foster dropped the kick and Harry Davis pounced on it for Neshaminy.

Three running plays netted five yards, putting the ball on the 20. The next play appeared to be an incompleated pass, but a 15-yard personal foul was called against Morrisville for roughing the passer. This gave the Redskins a first down on the five. Tom Stricker crashed through the left side of the line and scored on the next play. A bad pass from center prevented the attempted conversion.

Neshaminy kicked off and Dave Fabian returned to his own 35. Before the next play could start the half ended.

Gover Recovers Fumble

Neither team could do much in the third quarter. Early in the final period, Neshaminy's Ken Gover recovered a fumble on the Morrisville 24. The Redskins couldn't advance the ball past the 10.

In the closing minutes of play, a 15-yard penalty put the ball back on Neshaminy's own two yard line. George went back to punt but allowed himself to be tackled for a safety. This gave Morrisville two points and prevented the possibility of a blocked kick.

Neshaminy kicked from its own 20. With the aid of 20 yards in penalties against the Redskins, Morrisville returned the ball to the Neshaminy 15, where the game ended.

Punting Duel

For the most part the game was a punting duel between George of Neshaminy and Clarence "Moose" Janaski of Morrisville. George booted 10 times for a 36.4 average. His longest one was 44 yards. Janaski kicked eight times for a slightly higher average, 37.3. But his last two punts were two of the longest of the season, 54 and 63 yards. His average was brought down by two poor kicks (10 and 20 yards), the result of bad passes from center.
