

B. H. S. SWAMPS LANGHORNE BY SCORE OF 60 TO 0

Rolls Up Three Touchdowns In the First Period of Play

IS A RECORD DEFEAT

Worst Defeat Ever Administered to Any School Team

LANGHORNE, Nov. 6—Rolling up three touchdowns in the first period, and adding two in each of the final three quarters, Coach Tom Camplion's Cardinal and Grey grid warriors crushed the Langhorne Red Raiders under the biggest score ever registered by a Bristol high team over any rival in the history of football at the school. It also marked the worst defeat of a Lower Bucks team ever administered.

The final tabulation was 60-0. The score alone suffices to tell the story in this lopsided affair.

Danny DiMidio opened the scoring barrage early in the initial period when he grabbed an enemy aerial on Langhorne's 42 yard line and proceeded to gallop over the goal line for the six-pointer.

Later a bad pass from center went over Al Nemec's head and into the end zone. The Redskin back ran back, picked up the ball, and in an awful hurry booted it out on the two yard line from where DiMidio cracked over on the first play to score the second tally.

Near the close of the canto, Clem Peterpaul, behind good interference, dashed 18 yards around end to go over standing up. On each of these touchdowns, Morris "Bud" Carter added the extra point on three beautiful place-kicks, to give the Cards a 21-0 edge at the period.

A spectacular pass, Carter to Gil Herman, was good for a total of 45 yards and a touchdown early in the second chapter. The aerial was completed on the 30 and from there, Herman raced into the end zone. Carter missed the extra point on a placement for the first time.

In the same chapter, Bill Capella intercepted a pass on the home club's 22 yard line and returned it 21 2-3 yards, being downed on the one foot line. This time it was Tony DiAngelo who busted the line to score the six-pointer with Carter completing a pass to Herman for the extra tally, making it 34-0 at half-time.

By this time the comedy was over and the fans started to leave. But still the points rolled in for the Cards, who added another pair of six-pointers in each of the final two sessions to complete the rout.
