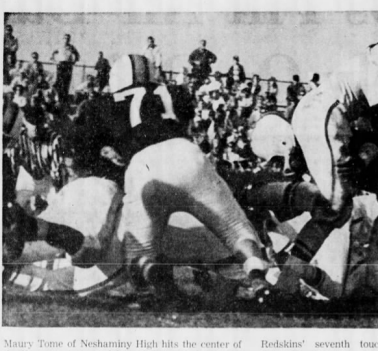
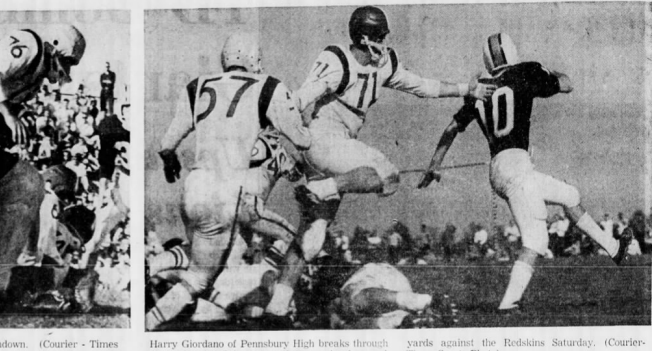

That's the lesson Pennsylvan High learned the hard way in a 14-0 rout last night when it traveled to Neshaminy to face the Redskins' 4-1-1 team.

Powerful Neshaminy got a key break from manufacturer errors in prompt order and turned a rather slow yard struggle into a temporary rout.

The key which unlocked the football scorebook for the champion in the second quarter occurred when the Redskins' 36 and 37 yard touchdown.

## Patterson Fue Liston To Defend Title In February

NEW YORK CITY — Heavyweight champion Sonny Liston appeared to be tired to go on tonight to get "vading money," an assumed belief he will break away from Championship Sports Inc. and make his first title defense in February against Floyd Patterson.

Through adviser Jack Niemi, Sonny made his announcement which designated the new 30,000-seat Baltimore Civic Center as the preferred site for the return fight with Patterson.

Niemi said Sonny will break his 1951 record by making two fights for a total of \$1 million for himself and make his February defense under new conditions. It was Championship Sports Inc. which bought the rights to the Coney Island Cup on Sept. 25, when it was 10-0.

But Niemi charged today that Championship Sports' failed to pay \$200,000 within 48 hours after the Chicago fight, as contracted.

Niemi added, "And the rest of it would have been paid to me by Liston. Give Patterson his fight in New York City."

The only money Liston received was \$250,000 from Championship Sports, even given him at the time he accepted the formal "training agreement" entered in Chicago weeks before the fight, Niemi stressed.
