

Athletic Committee Favorable

Neshaminy Studies \$100,000 Stadium

The athletic committee of the Neshaminy School Board will advise construction of a new high school football stadium as soon as it is financially possible, according to William Van Tilburg, school board and athletic committee member.

Estimated cost of the new stadium, based on cost of a stadium recently built by the Pennsbury Joint School Board, is \$100,000.

John Paul, business administrator for the school district, reported that no funds are made available in the 1961-62 budget for such a construction.

Van Tilburg said present facilities are inadequate and that the athletic committee is generally

agreed that something must be done to improve the facilities.

Draw Large Crowds

He said that the construction is needed to accommodate crowds attending Neshaminy games, particularly since the school has signed a new contract placing Neshaminy in the new East Penn athletic conference, which includes such large schools as William Allen High School in Allentown and Liberty High School, Bethlehem.

Van Tilburg said no decision has been made on where the new stadium would be built, but indicated that if it is built on the present stadium site adjacent to
