

'Skins Romp Over Tiger Eleven, 45-0

For five minutes of play, Delhaas looked like a world-beater against Neshaminy Saturday night. But suddenly lightning struck and before it was over the Redskins had scored an easy 45-0 triumph over the Delhaas boys at the Bristol Township Field.

Close to 1,000 fans saw the Tigers play fierce football in the early part of the first quarter as they held the Neshaminy backs and then registered a first down when they took the ball on a series of plays.

But before the quarter was over Neshaminy had crossed the goal-line twice, added three more in the second session and climaxed its scoring with another pair in the third stanza. It was a scoreless affair in the final period as the 'Skins dug deep into their reserve list.

Four Touchdown Passes

The seven Neshaminy touchdowns were divided among seven players with four on aerials thrown by Bill Brundzo. Two were scored on runs with the other being a pass interception.

The best run of the night was Bob Barr's 60 yard scamper for a touchdown in the second quarter. Bill Schemberg booted two conversions while Bob Baxter made the other.

It was Neshaminy's fifth straight win since being beaten by Easton in its third game of the season. The Redskins are 7-1 for the year. Delhaas has one victory in six games.

Delhaas really staggered the Neshaminy team and caused quite a fury among the Neshaminy coaches by its play early in the contest. On the first running play, the Delhaas line broke through and tossed Brundzo for a 10-yard loss and despite a five-yard penalty on the Tigers they managed to hold the 'Skins for downs.

Delhaas Gets First Down

When Delhaas received the ball after the kick, Karl Eysenbach broke loose for a 14-yard run but afterwards, Neshaminy held for downs and Steve McGruder booted to the Neshaminy 20.

That was the end of the night as far as Delhaas was concerned as after that it was never within the Neshaminy 25.

Neshaminy scored on six plays from its 20 with Brundzo throwing a 22-yard end zone pass for the touchdown. Following the kick-

off, Neshaminy hit pay dirt again when Mike Wingfield intercepted one of Eysenbach's passes and ran 22 for a touchdown.

Brundzo Again

Brundzo tossed a 25-yard pass to Johnny Vosburgh for Neshaminy's third touchdown early in the second session. In the same period, Barr scampered 60 yards for a touchdown and as time was running out Neshaminy received a break when Steve McGruder could not get off a kick and ran the ball, being spilled on his 24. In four plays, Evans crossed from the seven.

Neshaminy had the Tigers trapped deep in their territory in the third period with a kick only going out to the 32. From this spot, the 'Skins gained 12 yards on two line plays and then Brundzo whipped a pass over the center to Tom Preno who caught it on the five and went over.

Evans set up his own touchdown for the final score of the night as he ran back a kick 51 yards to the Delhaas' four from where he lugged it over.
