

Neshaminy Roars Over Wilson, 40-0

Neshaminy High began defense of its Lower Bucks County League championship with an easy 40-0 triumph over Woodrow Wilson High Saturday in a game which saw the overall individual scoring record of Lower Bucks get shattered.

It marked the first circuit clash for both teams. Neshaminy had previously beaten Bishop Egan and Chester and tied Easton in non-league tilts while Wilson dropped previous pre-league games to Upper Merion and Abington.

Hammering Harry Schuh broke the Lower Buck's overall scoring mark by tallying a pair of

touchdowns in the first period to bring his total points to 244. The previous mark was 235 held by Don Cameron, also of Neshaminy, made during the years of 1953-54. However, Cameron made his count in 20 games while Schuh has already played 23 Neshaminy games. Schuh is now 12 points away from the Lower Bucks League mark of 168 points also held by Cameron.

Five Players Score

In addition to Schuh, the other six-pointers were made by Jack Stricker, Jack Currie, Joe Rothrock and Johnny Buhner. Bill Schemberg's left foot booted four placements for conversion points.

The bright spots for Wilson was its strong passing attack, especially in the third quarter and the Schuh after the first period. The Rams went into the air 21 times and completed 10 for 114 yards. In the third session, Wilson completed six out of 10 aeriels. It was this quarter which saw coach Dick Northrup's team made its strongest bid for a score as it marched to the Neshaminy six

only to be set up by a penalty.

Schuh carried the ball 10 times after scoring his second touchdown, gaining 22 yards and being thrown for losses of 10 yards to give him a net of 12 yards. However, he caught a 30-yard pass from Stricker which brought the ball to the Wilson 29 in the second quarter.

The contest was a battle of the single wing. Both teams used a 6-2-2 defense but the Redskins' were much stronger in this department.

Three TD's In First

Neshaminy scored the first time it had the ball from scrimmage. It was on its 44 when Schuh broke loose on an end run and went the distance for the touchdown. Shortly after, the "Skins were in possession again on the Wilson 49 recovering a fumble. Stricker netted four yards off tackle and then found an opening to slit through for a 45-yard touchdown. Later in the stanza, Gummell recovered a Wilson fumble on the 40 and from there the champs went for their third score, Schuh going over from the 11.

In the first play of the second quarter, Jack Currie intercepted a pass thrown by Richie Johnson and went 42 yards for the TD. That was all the scoring until the middle of the last period when Joe Rothrock climaxed a 61-yard drive by sprinting 38 yards on an end run. With about one minute to play, Johnny Buhner took the ball on a reverse and scampered 18 yards for a touchdown.
