

Redskins Tab 32-6 Win; Preparations Made For Easton

CHESTER — Hours of studying last year's Neshaminy - Easton films, looking over this season's scouting reports and polishing up the offensive attack will be the three-pronged program designed this week by head coach John Petercuskie of Neshaminy High School.

This is the week which Lower Bucks County football fans have been waiting for. Last year Neshaminy finished 10-1 and its only blemish was a 13-7 loss to Easton.

Neshaminy is girding for this one but the Redskins had to bypass Chester High on Saturday before laying plans for Saturday night's match with the Red Rovers.

Neshaminy Rips Chester

The Redskins disposed of Chester, 32-6, with a torrid running game which had to contend with a big, bulky Chester forward wall.

The "Roughriders" ran right over the big Chester line anchored by Don Masse (195), Bob Crawford (202), Art English (203), and Kirk McCollough (207) and also handled the pounding of 6-1, 228-pound Neil (Big Daddy) Watson, the Clippers' fullback.

Neshaminy rolled up four touchdowns on the ground and another six-pointer on a recovered fumble in the end zone by lineman Dick Blodgett.

Stricker Notches 3

Fleet Jack Stricker, with the help of running mate Fran McCollum and the rough-house blocking of Harry Schuh and Rich Boerckel, notched three touchdowns.

Neshaminy headed off with its second straight run-away victory in the first period when Stricker ran back a Chester punt 60 zig-zag yards. Bill Schemberger booted the PAT and the show was on the road.

The Redskins picked up 18 points in the second period and hung up another six-pointer in the fourth session.

8-Man Line

Chester could do little with the eight-man line thrown up by the "Savages" and only scored on a kickoff return. Watson took the ball after Neshaminy's third touchdown and "shocked" everyone on hand by running straight up the middle of the field, picking up a wall of blockers, and roaring 65 lengths to tally.

The Lower Bucks County eleven held Chester in check most of the day. The Clippers managed to pick up only 43 yards on the turf and five yards on one completed pass, a jumper over the right end.

Neshaminy's highly-tutored running corps carved the towering opponents to shreds to the tune of 205 yards. However, the "Skins" accounted for 117 yards alone in

the second session.

Stricker opened the scoring early in the first period. Stricker picked up a punt on the 40-yard line. He wiggled his way past a Chester defender and churned the distance to score standing up.

13-0 Lead

Stricker and McCollum triggered a 41-yard drive beginning late in the first period and ending in the second period to give Neshaminy a 13-0 lead. The march was covered in eight plays with Schuh, a 235 - pound fullback, clearing most of the way with crushing blocks. Stricker knifed his way over the final yard right on the heels of Schuh.

Blodgett, a 218-pound guard, gave the 'Skins their fourth TD. Chester was forced to begin its operations on the one-yard line after John Vossburgh's punt, which went 30-yards, was mishandled and downed by Chester on its own one. Jack Donald fumbled and Blodgett fell on the ball for the score.

Chester Scores

Watson returned the kickoff for Chester's lone touchdown.

Schuh started Neshaminy on its next drive. He bashed 25 yards to the Chester 46-yard line. Five plays later McCollum ran seven yards to score.

Neshaminy's last TD came midway in the fourth period. An 88-yard push was climaxed when Stricker bolted three yards to score his third touchdown of the game. Schemberger's kick was true for a 32-6 final score.
