

More Honors For Stricker

Neshaminy's Jack Stricker added more honors to his growing list yesterday when he was named to the first team of the 1960 Blue Cross - Blue Shield All-Scholastic football team selected by the Delaware Valley Scholastic Football Coaches Association.

Hawthorne Duckett, backfield star of the crack Central Bucks eleven, was also named to the first team while a second-team selection was end Joe Arcade of Central Bucks.

Stricker is one of the two hold-overs from last season's team as the Neshaminy tail-back along with Bernie Dallas, of Germantown Academy, were placed on the 1959 alternate Blue Cross-Blue Shield team.

Also selected as end of the first team was Jim Esposito of Lincoln High, son of former Bristolian Jim Esposito, Sr., who in his school days was an end at Bristol High.
