Bishop Kenrick has learned firsthand what already is common knowledge to most Southeastern Pennsylvania schools: Neshaminy has quite a football team.

The Golden Knights launched their brand new rivalry with the Redskins last night and came out on the short end of a 20-6 thriller, but not before giving their host more than it bargained for.

Neshaminy had to hang tenaciously to a 7-0 lead through three quarters, then got some breathing room with two more touchdowns in the final period. Kenrick prevented a shutout on an unusual aerial with three seconds remaining.

The victory, Neshaminy's ninth against one tie this season, puts the Redskins on the threshold of their second unbeaten-but-tied season in three years. Their final hurdle in Bensalem next Friday night.

### Baxter, Barr Star

Big gun offensively for the Redskins was Bob Baxter who tallied a pair of touchdowns and booted a pair of extra points while upping his unofficial Lower Bucks scoring record to 166 points. He played another outstanding game.

Not far behind, though, was Bob Barr who also performed in fine fashion while scoring the Redskins' initial TD on a 42-yard scamper as 5500 fans looked on.

Baxter's first touchdown was on a 27-yard trap play with 10:23 left to play which, when he toed the pigskin for the PAT, gave the 'Skins a 14-0 advantage. His second six-pointer was on a one-yard plunge with 2:06 on the clock.

Besides contending with a formidable Norristown eleven, Neshaminy also had to battle the elements in the form of a light drizzle which persisted from the opening kickoff.

It kept the pigskin slippery all night long and enabled the Golden Knights' interior forward wall, which averaged 2x30 pounds tackle to tackle, to slow up the Neshaminy attack.

### Miss Opportunities

Although the Redskins had to nurse that one touchdown advantage through three quarters, they had several other opportunities to score before the final period but time and time again the visitors held deep in their own territory.

They first stalled the 'Skins at the two-yard-line midway through the second quarter, then a bit later surrendered possession on a fumble recovery by tackle Rudy Kalan at the 23 but didn't allow their host to get an inch closer.

In the third quarter the Redskins marched 53 yards with the kickoff but their offensive drive bogged down 10 yards from paydirt. When they next acquired possession, however, they drove 59 yards in five plays for their second touchdown.

### March 63 Yards

Neshaminy's first-quarter TD has consumed 63 yards in nine plays the first time the 'Skins had possession. Their final touchdown climaxed a 15-yard advance following Baxter's 20-yard run-back of a punt.

Bishop Kenrick (6-4) had trouble moving against the 'Skins although their workhorse pile-driving fullback Dennie Morgan was a constant ground-gainer for short
