

Stricker Scores 2, Gains 224 Yards In 27-0 Rout

Neshaminy High's Redskins rolled to their sixth victory of the season last night, crushing Lower Merion High, 27-0, before 3500 fans at Playwicki Field.

The Redskins, who currently are leading the Lower Bucks County League race with a 4-0 record, won their second non-league contest of the year. Neshaminy trounced Penridge and was nipped by Easton in other non-LBCL activity this season.

Neshaminy scored the first three times it got possession of the pigskin.

Jack Stricker, who played probably the greatest game of his career, scored the first two Neshaminy touchdowns on runs of two and 91 yards. A John Kurtz to Werner Frentrop pass covered 33 yards and was good for 10 number three. Harry Schuh crossed over into paydirt with the fourth touchdown from nine yards out.

Ramsey Kicks Three

Bob Ramsey kicked placements after the first three touchdowns but was wide to the left after the fourth.

Stricker accounted for 224 of the 313 yards gained via rushing by Neshaminy. He carried the ball 22 times, for an average of 10.2 yards per carry. In addition to his spectacular 91-yard touchdown jaunt, Stricker had runs of 12, 17, 21 and two of 10 yards.

Neshaminy took the opening kickoff and marched 69 yards in

a dozen running plays. Stricker capped the drive by crashing over for the final two yards. Lower Merion took the ensuing kickoff and drove from its own 34 to the Neshaminy 28 before it was stalled.

91-Yard Gallop

On fourth down, Bill Ponzer punted for Lower Merion and the ball went out of bounds on the Neshaminy one. Schuh bulled through the middle for two yards and Stricker made six. With a third down and two-yards-to-go situation on the nine Stricker broke off his own right tackle, found daylight and outraced the Aces' secondary on the 91-yard gallop.

Schuh provided a very important block in helping get Stricker off to the races.

Neshaminy kicked to Lower Merion. The Aces couldn't get anywhere and were forced to punt. Ed Kaminski returned the punt 39 yards to the LM 31. On the next play, Kurtz passed to Frentrop, who gathered the ball in on the 15 and raced over for the score.

Schuh weeps End

Neshaminy took the second half kickoff and marched 62 yards, on the ground only, for its final TD. Schuh swept right end for the final nine yards, knocking down two defenders enroute.

The Lower Merion offense, which couldn't get far in the first half, started to click late in the third stanza. The Aces marched from their own 31 down to the Neshaminy four. But they lost the ball on downs early in the fourth quarter.

Neshaminy was forced to punt only twice and Dave Cooper got off two beautiful kicks. The first was for 39 yards and the second for 50. The latter boot landed dead on the LM four. On the first play, Neshaminy recovered a fumble. However the Redskins failed to capitalize.

Lower Merion quarterback Phil Parthemore took to the air in the closing minutes of the game, hoping to avert the shutout. With six seconds left in the game, one of his aerials was intercepted by Kaminski. He caught the pass on the LM 45 and raced all the way down to the two-yard line on the final play of the game.
