In 1951 Pennsylvania was undefeated when it played the Owls of Bensalem. The Owls pulled out a 2-0 victory and Pennsylvania cracked at the seams. Bristol was the league king in 1951.

In 1952 Pennsylvania dropped a 24-20 decision to Neshaminy, but was still in the running late in the year. Neshaminy was downed by Pennsylvania and later defeated Pennsylvania to clinch for the championship. Neshaminy would have been a co-champion but Council Rock surprised the Falcons with a 13-13 tie from the picture.

Neshaminy took over Pennsylvania in 1955 with a 20-6 triumph. Last year the teams tied but Bristol helped upset title hopes for Pennsylvania.

Pennsylvania High School used every ounce of reserve strength to thrust back repeated second half threats and break Neshaminy High School's stranglehold on the Lower Bucks County League with an exciting 7-6 conquest before 3,000 fans last night at Langhorne.
