

Redskin 'S' Men Romp To 46-0 Win

There were two many "S's" in the Neshaminy backfield for Bristol High last night as 3,500 fans saw the Warriors go down to a blistering 46-0 defeat in a Lower Bucks League game at the Bristol High Field. It was the second circuit win for the Redskins and the first loss for the Warriors whose league mark is 0-1-1.

The S-men that hit the scoring trail for the winners were Jack Strickler and Harry Schuh who scored two touchdowns each and Bill Schemberg who booted four extra points. Then three other backfield runners kept up the S-attack by snake-hipping their way to touchdowns. The trio were Franny McCollum, Bob Barr and Bruce Evans.

The 'Skins scored pairs of touchdowns in the first three periods and added a final TD in the fourth quarter. Schuh and Stricker divided the first four touchdowns and gave the Neshaminy team a 27-0 lead going into the recess.

Bristol Stalls

Bristol's offense was bogged down from the start. Until the final period, the Warriors' never got within 45 yards of the Neshaminy goal line. In the last session, aided by a 15-yard penalty, Bristol got to the Neshaminy 33 with 20 seconds remaining to be played.

Neshaminy gained 329 yards on the ground and completed its only pass for a 21-yard gain. In the first quarter, the Redskins picked up 159 yards on the turf and added 71 more in the second period. The winners had 13 first downs to Bristol's four. Bristol did not make a first down in the third quarter.

By scoring his two touchdowns,

Schuh deadlocked the Lower Bucks scoring record of 163 points. Don Cameron scored the same number of points while playing for Neshaminy during the 1953 and 1954 seasons.

First TD

Neshaminy scored its first TD on the second play after the opening kickoff as Jack Stricker raced 71 yards behind wonderful interference to score.

Neshaminy held Bristol after the touchdown kickoff and Jim Corrigan booted to the Neshaminy 36. In five plays, the 'Skins went over for another score with Schuh going the final 15 runs around end. Schuh and Stricker had 17-yard runs during the drive.

The third touchdown for the visitors came in the second quarter. It was a 67 yard drive which started towards the finish of the first period. Stricker went over on a three-yard plunge after Franny McCollum set up the score by catching a 21-yard pass from Stricker.

Schuh Stars

Schuh was a committee of one in the fourth touchdown. The ball was on the Neshaminy 47 when Schuh busted the Bristol line for 10-yards. Schuh then made a gain which was nullified by a penalty, the ball going to the Bristol 46. The 235-pound fullback carried the ball again and whipped through the line into the open for the six-pointer.

A 44-yard return of a punt by Stricker made the next score possible as the ball was placed on the 15 from where Franny McCollum took it over.

Bob Barr registered the sixth touchdown on a seven-yard line plunge after the Neshaminy line broke through the blocked Corrigan's punt on the 12.

In two plays, Neshaminy went 46 yards for its final score. Barr paced off 45 yards on an end run while Evans made the score from the one.
