

Neshaminy Scores Second League Win; Rips Tennent, 21-0

Neshaminy High School's "Rough Riders" found the going real tough for three periods but still finished a 21-0 victor over visiting William Tennent of Johnsville before 4,000 fans last night at Langhorne.

Neshaminy's free-wheeling scoring machine almost came to a grinding halt when Tennent tossed up a dogged defense for three periods before succumbing to sheer power. The "Roughriders" harried all over the turf in rolling up 206 yards and three scores which virtually wore the Panthers out.

Tennent, although it lost its second straight game, gave all pre-game prognosticators red faces by stalling Neshaminy until the fourth period. The Panthers were a 28-point underdog in the contest but did yield the points like expected.

Schuh Gets Two

Hammering Harry Schuh and fleet Jack Stricker provided the touchdowns for the "Roughriders" and 145-pound Bob Rumsey added the trio of extra points on perfect placements.

Schuh jacked his touchdown total to five in the Lower Bucks County Football League and eight

overall. Stricker has hit paydirt three times in conference battles and four in all games.

Neshaminy now leads the LBCL with a 2-0 record. It was the opening league test for the Panthers, Neshaminy's eight-year conference mark (including 1959) is now 46-2-2.

Roberts Stars

Tennent's bright light was carried by 5-10, 175-pound Ray Roberts. The Panther back ripped holes through the "Savage" Redskin forward wall and average seven yards per carry on 15 tries.

Stricker did the most gaining for Neshaminy last night, many coming on end sweeps with Schuh leading the way. He picked up 133 yards on 16 carries for a 8.36 per carry mark. Schuh, who bulls his way along, averaged 4.6 per smack, gaining 60 yards on 13 attempts.

Neshaminy's balanced running game is equaled by a strong stepping Tom Rickards. The 166-pound junior packed the mail on

eight carries, made 53 yards, for a 6.62 average.

Early Lead

The "Roughriders" took a 7-0 lead in the second period after a terrific defensive battle by both clubs in the first period. The Langhorne eleven began a march on its own 16-yard line and drove 84 yards on 12 plays, digesting a 15-yard penalty along the route.

One pass was thrown in the push, a five-yarder from John Kurtz to Stricker. Stricker moved the ball 13 yards on two plays to the two-yard line. Schuh tried to nuzzle the Tennent line but failed. The next play he lashed into the right side to tally with 5:25 remaining on the clock. Rumsey connected for a 7-0 edge.

Tennent came to life on the kick-off. Tennent's Phil David took a reverse on the kickoff on the 32 and roared 59 yards to the nine yard line. A diving tackle by Neshaminy's Dick Heid prevented David from scoring. The Panthers lost the ball on downs on the one yard line when Roberts failed to make the yardage.

Costly Fumble

Neshaminy worked the ball out to the 17-yard line when Schuh fumbled and Roberts fell on the ball. Tennent had 49 seconds to work the ball but a fumble cost the Panthers 20 yards after Roberts had raced 10 yards to the Neshaminy seven.

The "Roughriders" rode 77 yards to score their second touchdown. The drive opened on the Neshaminy 33 in the third period. Time ran into the final session and on the second play of the period, Stricker galloped 27 lengths with 11:37 left to play for a six-pointer.

The final score came with 4:50 remaining. A poor Tennent kick from the Panther 14 yard line traveled 24 yards. Stricker returned the boot to the Tennent 29. Four plays later Schuh crashed into the end zone. Rumsey hit his third straight boot and it was all over.
