Rumsey's conversions came after touchdowns by Errol Faunce in each of the first and second quar-ters. Morrisville (1-1) retaliated after each TD, but one conversion try was blocked by Andy Davis and a run for the second also failed.

Fenton Larrisey, returning to action after a little scholastic dif-ficulty, set up one TD with a 29yard run to the one, and scored the

The Morrisville gridders played Neshaminy even all the way and the margain of difference was the two extra points. George Rumsey, Neshaminy's right end, who booted the two points, must share the spotlight with Erroll Faunce, the quarterback, who scored both touchdowns.

electrifying 83-yard end run. His conversion attempt was blocked. thereby halting his previous perfect extra point record this season.

Neshaminy lost the ball on the very first scrimmage play of the game, when Jim Allhouse intercepted a Faunce pass. The Bulldogs couldn't advance and were forced to kick on fourth down. The punt was blocked by Andy Davis and Neshaminy took over on the Morrisville 29-yard-line.

After a two-yard loss, Ned Moyer gained 22 and Faunce rounded his own right end for 10 more and the first score of the game. Rumsey converted.

Neshaminy kicked off and Al Miller returned the pigskin to his own 17. On the next play Brewer took off on his 83-yard jaunt.

Later in the first period, Ed Pellegrino blocked a punt by Brewer and Neshaminy took over on the Morrisville 34. A 27-yard pass play from Faunce to Bob Picciotti put the ball on the five. Three plunges later Faunce went over from the

two to put Neshaminy in front, 13-6, on the first play of the second quarter. Rumsey converted.

Most of the second period was played between the two 30-yard lines and the field, still wet from the weekend rain, became a slip-"mud bowl". Late in the period, Jim Walsh of Morrisville kept the ball on an option play and went 19 yards to the Neshaminy six. Miller scored three plays later to make it 14-12. Morrisville tried

a running play for the extra point and it failed.

The Bulldogs' Ralph Demech took the second half kickoff and returned it to the 33. Miller made seven yards. On the next play, Brewer went to his right on an end sweep play, but he was boxed in. He reversed himself and went around the left side and broke into the clear. When he got to the Neshaminy 18-yard line he stopped and safety man Faunce knocked him out of bounds.

Brewer probably saw Faunce as he was running and thought he could outfox him and run around him if he stopped. It didn't work and the fans will argue for sometime whether or not Faunce could have caught Brewer had the latter kept running at top speed. The least that must be conceded is that Brewer would have made a few more yards anyway.

The Morrisville attack died a few minutes later and the Bulldogs never seriously threatened again,

There wasn't a penalty in the first half against either team but in the second half, Neshaminy lost

50 yards due to infractions.
