Bristol-CR Tilt Set For Monday; Others Next Month

Illness has struck most of the teams of the Lower Bucks County League, causing a postponement of the full weekend schedule. One game has been rescheduled for Monday night but even this remains a bit doubtful.

The Council Rock-Bristol game originally scheduled for tomorrow night, has been rescheduled for Monday night at Bristol. Bristol's coach Fred Prender has 16 of his 24 players on the sick list and unless there is a decent turnout for today's practice session, he will ask for another postponement until the weekend of November 22 when the other games will be played.

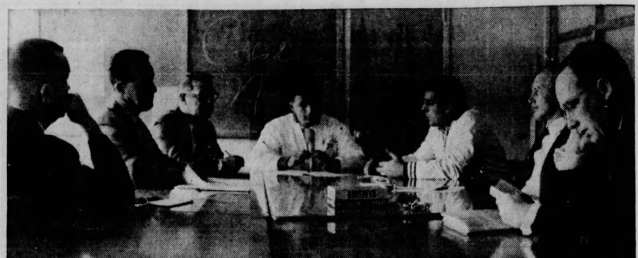

In 1956 Stricker and Snyder played plenty of varsity ball for their respective teams but when it came to scoring these boys were forced into the background.

The 1957 Lower Bucks County Football League season is one year old and Stricker and Snyder are off to flying starts. Stricker tallied 12 points against Bristol to his 1956 output. Snyder's two touchdowns against Council Rock doubled last year's production—according to statistics compiled by the Courier - Times sports department.

Stricker slipped through the Bristol defense for a 25-yard run and a 25-yard pass from Al Gasback for league markers. Snyder helped the Falcons drop Council Rock with runs of five and 15-yards for scores.

League openers saw 13 other players mark up six-pointers and three more gridders hit the scoring column with extra points and a safety. Only the Bensalem
