# Neshaminy Rips Pennsbury, 41-7

Neshaminy High spread its scoring power in every quarter to chalk up its sixth straight win in the Lower Bucks County League last night as it took Pennsbury High into camp by a lopsided 41-7 score before 1,000 fans at the Neshaminy Field.

The triumph moved Neshaminy a step closer to the Lower Bucks crown as it is the only team that has not been beaten or tied in league competition this season. Pennsbury fell out of that rank yesterday when it was tied by Delaware. The Redskins still have Delaware and Bensalem remaining on its schedule.

For Pennsbury, its hopes for winning or trying for the 4-0 went out the window as it was only a sliver of itself in losing to the Redskins and in addition it lost its star end, Al Mazzoza, who was

injured in the first period and detained at the Lower Bucks Hospital.

## Schub Scores Two

Harry Schub chalked up two touchdowns for the "Skins with Jack Stricker, Ed Fiorelli, Ed Kaminski and Ed Rhoads making the others. Bob Ramsey kicked four out of five conversion tries with Werner Frentrup making the other. The Pennsbury touchdown was made by Mike Klein, following a blocked kick by Bill Kramer. Kramer boosted the

extra point.

The outcome of the game was never in doubt as the Harry Frank-John Peteronius coached team scored after 5:30 of the first period was played and held a 14-0 lead at the quarter and 21-0 at the half. Two more scores made it 44:7 at the end of the third season and just before the final whistle the winners scored again.

The Redskins' ground attack was prevalent in the first half as it rolled up 204 yards and added 76 more in the air with four out of seven completions. All told, Neshaminy netted 308 yards for its night's work.

## Tough Defense

On the other hand, the Pennsbury team found it difficult to bust through the band of the "Six Savages" which comprise the Neshaminy line. The Falcons mustered 46 yards during the first half and showed a mimic one for

its second half efforts. They completed five of its 17 aerials for 60 yards, the 2-1 secondary of the Neshaminy team batting down the passes.

Not only did Schub cross the goal line twice but he was used in the role of a blocking back last night and did his job well as he opened the paths for Jack Stricker and Tom Rickards to get off on nice runs.

Schub made the first score of the game on a one-yard plunge to end a 75-yard drive from the first offensive series of plays for the

Falcons. It took seven plays for the touchdown with a 29-yard pass, Jimmy Kurtz of Trenton, being Jimmy Kurtz of them.

## Stricker Scores

It took four plays for Neshaminy to go 64 yards on the second series of plays with Jack Stricker leading the final 33 on an end run.

The third Neshaminy TD was unexpected as it was on the Pennsbury 16 with 16 seconds remaining to be played in the half. Two plays ate up nine seconds and on the third, Kurtz hit Fiorelli with an end zone pass for the touchdown.

After Kramer blocked a kick in the third period, Pennsbury came back to score on a 16-yard pass play, George Tama to Mike Klein. But after the kickoff, Kaminski broke Pennsbury's back with an 82-yard puntback of the kick. Ed Rhoads brought the scoring to a climax with less than a minute to play by intercepting Tama's pass and going 40 yards for the TD.

Morrisville High School staged its winning in the fourth session to mark up their fourth LRLC win in five starts. Morrisville has a 5-1 overall line.

William Tennent's eleven which remained winning striking distance of Morrisville for three periods, fell to its fifth conference loss in seven entries and is now 2-6 for the season.

## Hurt Scores 13

The bag play in the move was 43 yard pass from Leon Okonowski to Hart. Hart was dropped on the six yard line. The next play the 220-pound fullback rammed the distance to score.

Neither team could threaten in the second period as tempers flared and personal fouls mounted. Tennent's Ron Schuman and Morrisville's Vince Straszynski engaged in a battle and both boys were removed from the game.

## Penalties Mount

Morrisville's problems continued in the third session as the Bulldogs were taxed another 69 yards for infractions.

Late in the third period Morrisville's Rich Connors was caught for a loss and was slammed down on the 35-yard line. He fumbled and David picked the ball off his fallen boy and scampered 31 yards behind five blockers for the touchdown. David's run for the PAT failed.

Tennent surrendered the ball to Morrisville mid-way in the initial period when set off the second TD drive The Panthers com-

pleted the drive on a 45-yard

run for the PAT.
