Neshaminy cut loose with a 20 - point fourth quarter last night to down Bethlehem, 34-14, before 6,000 at Liberty High Stadium.

Bill Brundzo and Bob Baxter churned up valuable yardage despite the muddy field and combined for four touchdowns to spearhead the Redskins to their fourth win in five games. The other game ended in a 14-14 tie with Allen.

The Redskins from Langhorne, preseason favorites to be Eastern Pennsylvania's top team, ripped off 314 yards on the ground and chalked up 16 first downs to dominate the game.

Fullback Les (The Tank) Amison sparked the Red Hurricane with his patented line smashes and a 75-yard scoring jaunt midway through the second period. However, the strong efforts of the 200-pounder failed to prevent the Red and Blue from receiving its second loss in four games.

Neshaminy, winner of 46 of its last 48 games and operating out of single and double wings, took the opening kickoff and marched 55 yards in 11 plays

with Brundzo going around end the final 13 yards at the midway mark. Baxter added his first of four placements.

Minutes later Rich Lauther intercepted Joe Saurino's pass at the 'Skins' 32. Four plays and a penalty moved the ball to the Hurricane 40. On the first play of the second period, Brundzo hit off tackle for a 40-yard score. Baxter kicked the PAT.

Bethlehem was not dead despite a 14-point deficit. At the midway point of the period after a punt, the Hurricane used just two plays to go 77 yards, with Amison smashing up the middle 75 yards for the TD. He also ran for the extra point.

The Hurricane, determined to get back into the game, expended for a quick score early in the second half. Taking the kickoff, the losers moved 80 yards in six plays, Frank Matla's arched flat pass to speedy Frank Mohap resulted in a 65-yard scoring play. Amison bucked over for the PAT.

Following the kickoff, the 'Skins held the ball for almost 10 minutes early into the final period. They drove 67 yards in 18 plays with Baxter plunging over from the 1. He added the conversion on a second attempt after Bethlehem was offside.

Late in the march Neshaminy guard John Reeves received a dislocated elbow. He was treated in St. Luke's Hospital.

About two minutes later the 'Skins scored again when Hurricane punter Duane Wartman failed to get off a punt after a bad pass from center.

On the first play, Baxter went around end 10 yards for the score and added the extra point.

Bethlehem then drove from its 26 to the 'Skins' 36 before two no gains and a 12-yard loss ended the threat.

Neshaminy followed by quickly moving 90 yards in six plays. Wingback Tom Preno scooted the final 61 yards with 11 seconds remaining in the game.

Souderton Overcomes Penalty, Gets PAT to Trip Quakertown

A seven-yard pass for a second-quarter extra point last night turned out to be the difference as Souderton nipped Quakertown, 14-

13, in a Bus-Mont League clash at Quakertown.

More than 4,000 watched as the two teams moved the ball easily in the first half, each one scoring the first two times it had the ball.

The winning point came after Greg Palmerio scored for the Indians from the nine to give them a 13-7 margin. The PAT was good, but a five-yard penalty

against Souderton put the ball back on the seven.

On the second attempt, quarterback Rich Roshong tossed to end Art Moyer for the successful point after.

The victory was the second in three games for Souderton in league play, while Quakertown is now 1-2. The win also broke Quakerton's two-game win streak over the Indians.

Jim Swartz, Roshong and Palmerio were the big guns for Souderton, eating up most of the Indians' 179 yards rushing. Swartz scored the first touchdown on a three-yard run climaxing a 72-yard, 16-play drive the first time Souderton had the ball. He also plunged for the PAT.

Quakertown's junior quarterback Jim Waite completed passes of 12 yards to Bob Johnson, and 10 and 18 yards to Rich Gardner to set up Quakertown's first TD. A toss to Willy Slotter finally put the ball across, and Barry Heverly kicked the point.

After Souderton took the 14-7 lead, Waite again engineered the Redwolves to a comeback. He com-
