

Scott sends recruiters a message as Central Bucks East overwhelms Neshaminy, 35-0

DOYLESTOWN — The major Division I programs recruiting Central Bucks East's big, speedy Bryan Scott view him as a defensive back or a receiver in college.

After his performance Saturday night at War Memorial Field, those recruiters may be wise to also give the 6-foot-2, 205-pound Scott strong consideration at tailback.

Scott rushed for 210 yards and three touchdowns in the Patriots' 35-0 Suburban One League National

Conference win over Neshaminy.

The majority of Scott's work came in the first two quarters, when he gained 183 yards and scored all three of his touchdowns to give Central Bucks East a 21-0 lead.

"I got such good blocking that I was able to get past the line of scrimmage and get loose in the secondary," Scott said. "I think that is every runner's dream, to be in the secondary."

"We did a much better job blocking for Bryan this week than we did last week, and because of that he

was outstanding," Patriots coach Larry Greene said.

The Patriots (2-0 overall, 1-0 league) were boosted by six Redskins turnovers.

After driving the opening kickoff 69 yards in six plays, the Patriots took a 7-0 lead on Scott's 3-yard run.

Neshaminy (0-2, 0-1) moved the ball inside the Patriots' 20-yard line on the next possession. However, a Mark Esposito fumble ended the drive.

Less than five minutes later, Scott's second scoring run, from 18

yards out, gave Central Bucks East a 14-0 lead.

Once again, the Neshaminy offense moved the ball inside the Patriots' 20-yard line, but it was stopped on defensive end Jake Walker's interception of a Brian Sperling screen pass.

"When we finally score a touchdown, I think it will be a big lift off our kids' shoulders," Redskins coach Mark Schmidt said. "I know it will be a big relief for me.

"It's not like we're doing everything totally wrong, we just are not

following through with what we have to do," he said.

The Redskins' offense was led by the passing combination of Sperling to Antoine Lovelace. Sperling finished 15 of 38 for 196 yards, suffering three interceptions, while Lovelace had seven receptions for 93 yards.
