

SCHOOL FOOTBALL TEAM QUARANTINED FOR POLIO

PLEASANTVILLE, N. J. (INS)—A football game was cancelled and the entire Pleasantville, N. J., High School team was quarantined after a player was stricken with polio.

The youth is 17-year-old James Clemenson, right end on the Pleasantville eleven.

When his illness was diagnosed as polio Friday night, authorities quarantined 35 players on the team and three coaches. All were given injections of gamma globulin.

The game scheduled with Neshaminy, Pa., was called off and New Jersey State Police intercepted some 500 Neshaminy rooters at Hammonton, sending them back home.
